Introduction of New Members & Guests- The following new members and guests introduced themselves; Gabi, Kathy and Ray Luna, Jordawn and Melanie Green, Angel and Holly Jensen, Susan Lovig, Julie Swartz, Kelly Gard, Don Burke, and Michelle Whitehead.

March Minutes- Motion passed that the March minutes be approved as printed in the newsletter.

**Treasurer's Report**- by Glenna Van Buskirk. The beginning balance in checking was \$3,647.48, income of \$1,260.49, expenses of \$2,115.47, cash on hand of \$25.00, JoAnn Pool Fund of \$1,340.12, 1 year CD at \$3,059.91, and checking account balance of \$2,792.50 for total assets of \$7,230.23.

Debbie Davenport asked about when the CD account matured. Glenna reported that it is May 7,2016. A motion was made and approved to move part or all of the money out of the CD and place it in the club checking account or a money market account in case funds run short from expenses. Glenna will talk with the RFC.

Sunshine Report- Carol Dombrowsky reported that she sent cards out to Jackie Decker and Diane Dombras.

**Ride JCHA Committee Report**- Karen House reported that the participants were up to 5500 riding hours with a 100 hour reward to Phyllis Pfaff who received a bar patch and 1<sup>st</sup> aid kit. Ride JCHA riding materials are available on the club website.

**Club Expenses-** A motion was passed to pay Amanda Anderson for the reusable decorations she bought for the Pear Blossom Parade that were used on the float. These included large horse balloons, silver horseshoes decorations, and blue/gold tinsel sash. She will need to turn in receipts to be reimbursed.

Willow Prairie Work Party - May 21- Karen Matheny reported that the road into camp is clear with just a few blow downs. The date for the cleanup looks good. The club has a special use permit for that weekend. Meet at 9:00 a.m. for a safety talk before starting on trails. Forest Service worker, Les Moscovo, was notified of our dates. # ARE YOU PLANNING TO CAMP IN OREGON NATIONAL FORESTS THIS SUMMER??

If you are, then be sure and take CERTIFIED WEED FREE HAY for your animals. The Forest Service can ticket you if they find you with non-certified hay.

Weed Free Hay is baled with special colored twine that sets it apart from other hay. There is no paperwork to go with it; they only look for the colored twine.

In the Rogue Valley the only grower we know with Certified Weed Free Hay is Buck Mtn Ranch, Prospect. Their phone number is 541-560-1137.
