JCHA Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order by Sabina at 7:01 pm.

Rollcall of BOD. All present except Carol Dombrowski who is recovering from surgery. Junior member also present. Thanked Debbie Davenport for the Root Beer floats for the meeting. **Introductions.** No new members or guests present. **Announcements.** Sabina apologized for the lack of minutes/newsletter for the June meeting because her phone failed to record the meeting audio, as Secretary, Kim Samitore was absent. Debbie Davenport requested a correction for the May meeting minutes that the typo stating the rails were purchased by the Oregon Equestrian Trails not the Rogue Valley Equestrian Trails. Sabina moved to accept the meeting minutes being absent and the correction to the May minutes. Sandi Humphres seconded the motion and all in favor to accept them.

Chick's Saddlery \$299.88. Lingo was won by Sabina Martin \$53.20, Poker was won by Frank Mowery. Beth Damon moved to accept the treasurers report as read. Sandi Humphres seconded it. All in favor.

No sunshine report because Carol is absent. We are going to send a card to Carol.

Ride JCHA Report. Kim Samitore earned 25, 50 and 100 hour badges, first aid kit, tag and cante bag. Karen reminded everyone to let her know about personalized awards ahead of time so she has time to order.

Hot Weather Tips

What should I do if my horse gets heat stroke?

Immediately soak the horse down with cool water, scraping it away and applying it continuously — this cooling process should stop once the chest feels cool to the touch and/or rectal temperature drops below 103.5°F.” She cautioned to be mindful of too rapid cooling, as in some cases, this can lead to muscle cramping.

Why is my horse panting in hot weather?

Rapid breathing is a last-ditch attempt to expel heat. Any horse will be breathing hard after working in hot weather, but if the “panting” continues after several minutes of rest, he may be having trouble cooling off.

How long does it take a horse to acclimate to hot weather?

We recommend a 15 to 21 day acclimation period for horses from cooler or drier climates traveling to compete or reside in hot, humid climates.

Acclimation increases the horse's tolerance to heat and exercise. You should still monitor the horse during training and competition in hot and humid climates.

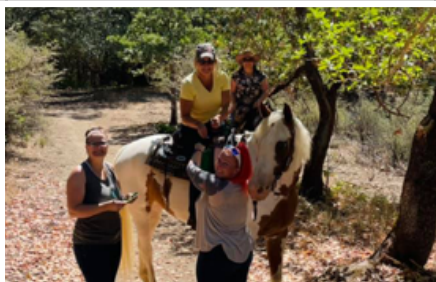

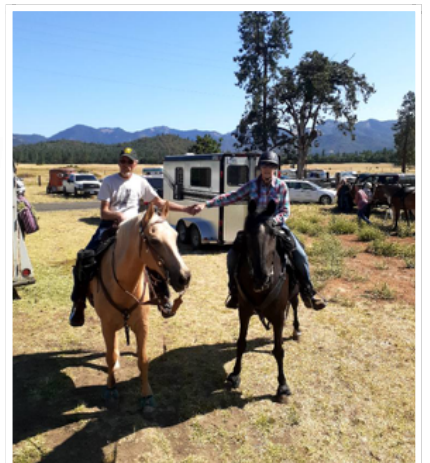
JCHA Youth Sponsorship Program
